Amongst others he was Treasury Finance Officer for the Kenyan Government and also First Secretary in the Diplomatic Service in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and as Deputy Director of the Overseas Development Institute. In 1995 he became Chief Economist for Shell International and has been Head of Economics at the Royal Institute of International Affairs. In 2003 he foresaw the current financial crisis and headed many warning campaigns.
