Mr Koolhaas first studied scriptwriting at the Dutch Film Academy, and was then a journalist for the *Haagse Post* before starting studies, in 1968, in architecture at the Architectural Association School of Architecture in London, followed, in 1972, by further studies at Cornell University in New York. He has won several International Awards including the Pritzker Architecture Prize in 2000, the Royal Gold Medal in 2004 and the Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement at the 2010 Venice Biennale. In 2005 he co-founded *Volume Magazine* and in 2008, *Time* put him in their top 100 of The World's Most Influential People.
