Sir Geoff Hurst is the only soccer player ever to score a hat-trick in a World Cup Final. Geoff played for England 49 times and scored 24 goals. After 16 years he retired from top flight soccer, and started his own motor warranty business with fellow team mate Martin Peters. As Director of Football for McDonalds UK, he has helped create 10,000 new football coaches, coaching children across the UK. He was inducted in the English Football Hall of Fame in 2004 and in 2009 football fans across the UK voted for him to receive the Lifetime Achievement award at the International Football Awards.

Geoff Hurst's distinguished career started in 1959 with West Ham United at Upton Park. He made 411 league appearances, 88 cup appearances, and in a grand total of 499 appearances scored a massive 248 goals. Geoff was awarded an MBE in 1977 and in 1998 was knighted for 30 years of service and contribution to football. Since 1995 he has been busy with speaking engagements and personal endorsements.
