From October 1984 he was Professor of Economics at the London School of Economics where he founded the Financial Markets Group. He now lectures at New York University's Stern School of Business and School of Law as a visiting professor. Lord King has been listed as the eleventh most influential person in the Financial Centres International top 500.
