Daniel Domscheit-Berg is a German technology activist and IT security expert. He helped build the WikiLeaks platform from late 2007 to September 2010 and acted as its spokesperson under the pseudonym Daniel Schmitt. He quit WikiLeaks over disputes about its strategic orientation, lack of transparency and management style.

Daniel's pre-WikiLeaks career involved building large-scale networks for the automotive and transport industries. Recognised as one of Foreign Policy magazine's Top 100 Global Thinkers in 2011, today he actively contributes to internet projects promoting privacy, anonymity and decentralised infrastructure. In 2017, he founded Verstehbahnhof, a collaborative makerspace and educational hub in Brandenburg. The initiative brings together young people, educators, and technologists to explore programming, electronics, and digital fabrication. It has grown into an inspiring ecosystem for digital education, demonstrating Daniel's belief that access to technology and knowledge should be democratic, inclusive, and community-driven.
