He is Professor of Globalisation and Development at the University of Oxford and a Professorial Fellow at Balliol College. He also directs several major Oxford Martin School research programmes focused on technological and economic change, the future of work, and development.

His distinguished career includes serving as Vice President of the World Bank, where Ian managed strategic relationships with the UK and European nations and helped shape global development policy in partnership with the UN. Before this, he was Chief Executive of the Development Bank of Southern Africa, advising President Nelson Mandela and overseeing finances for South Africa's 2010 Olympic bid. He has also been Principal Economist at the EBRD and Programme Director at the OECD in Paris, specialising in trade and sustainable development. He is the author and presenter of three major BBC documentary series: *After the Crash*, *Will AI Kill Development?*, and *The Pandemic that Changed the World*.
