Maria Ressa is a globally respected journalist, author, media executive, and Nobel Peace Prize laureate, widely recognised as one of the leading defenders of press freedom, democracy, and truth in the digital age. She is best known for her work exposing how power, technology, and disinformation undermine democratic institutions, and for championing journalism as a force for accountability and civic integrity.

IN DETAIL:

Maria co-founded Rappler, an independent digital news organisation at the forefront of defending press freedom in the Philippines. She has received numerous international honours, including an Emmy Award, the Golden Pen of Freedom, and the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize. In 2021, she was co-awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for her courageous defence of free expression, a cornerstone of democracy. A vocal critic of human rights abuses under President Rodrigo Duterte, she was subjected to sustained legal harassment and intimidation by his government, drawing global attention to the risks faced by independent journalists.

Known for her hard-hitting investigations into corruption and human rights abuses, Maria has faced threats and intimidation from influential people worldwide. She never backs down from confrontation or conflict and is internationally recognised as a true champion of free speech and democracy.
