A former State Secretary (1998–2001), he has held numerous high-level diplomatic posts, including serving as the EU representative in the Kosovo Troika (2007) and the OSCE representative for Ukraine (2014). In 2015, he chaired the OSCE-mandated Panel of Eminent Persons on European Security.
